Access

Our workshops often take place both within our roof top studio and also the Galleries. This means moving between different areas and levels of the museum. If any of your pupils have specific access requirements please let us know.

Activities and resources

Our sessions include a range of different learning activities. If you wish to find out more about the resources and equipment that will be used within a session, please contact the Bookings Hub who will pass on your enquiry to the Learning Assistants at that venue

Timings

If you have booked a workshop, the time stated on your bookings confirmation is the start time of the workshop. If you wish to have a snack before the session, or visit the shop afterwards, please factor this in to your bus schedule. Please note our venues do not open until 10am (11am on a Friday).

Fire evacuation

In the event of the fire alarm sounding, please follow the instructions from staff. Take your class register with you throughout your visit, especially if your class are split up in the galleries, so you can check off attendance at the designated muster point which is Virgin Bank at the north east corner of Royal Exchange Square.

Getting the most from your visit

Teachers and accompanying adults are expected to get involved during sessions. This not only supports group work, but allows teachers to connect between class and museum learning.

Why not bring a camera with you? Photographs are a great way of revisiting the learning back in class.

Workshop: Glasgow Stories in Architecture walking and sketching tour (Pr5-7)

Sketching tour around Glasgow will take approximately 40 minutes (GoMA, Royal Exchange Square, George Square, Glasgow City Chambers). We will take the shortest route, however, we will have to cross at busy pedestrian crossings, so we will have to be vigilant/aware. For this purpose, we will always need at least 3 adults plus the class teacher to accompany each visit (4 in total). Please dress for walking and being out of doors. The remainder of the session will take place in the studio space.

*we will provide hi-visibility vests for all children, teachers and parents attending.
