Road Safety Mascots




Teddy

Get to know your crossings

You'll see me at the roadside at the start and end of every school day. But when I'm not there, these are the ways to cross the road safely.



Challenge 3

Match the cartoon animal with the right road crossing photo.



Puffin

My crossing is especially for pedestrians. When it's time to cross the green man will light up above the pushbutton.



Pelican

At my crossing you need to press the button and WAIT until the green man appears on the other side of the road.



Zebra

You can't miss my black and white stripes on the road and my yellow beacon.



Toucan


My crossing is shared by two types of road user – cyclists and pedestrians. It's designed so that two can cross.

The museum's toucans

The museum has more than one toucan on display: there's the toucan crossing... and the aracari, a member of the toucan family from South America.



Take a close look at the Toucan crossing on display – there's a wee surprise.



Challenge 4

Go to the yellow and black box with the pushbutton. Use your hand to feel underneath. Is there something very small that sticks out? What do you think this is for?

Now press the pushbutton. Watch what happens. Remember to keep feeling underneath the box.

The answer is over the page.



Feeling Safe



Did you find the small black tactile cone? It is especially for people who are visually impaired.



When it spins round this indicates the green man has appeared and it's time to cross.

Think about what else helps visually impaired people cross the road.

Blast from the past
This is a Glasgow school crossing in 1955, a long time ago! Do you notice any differences with your school crossing today?
